Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: Columbia Basin College is proposing repealing Chapter 132S-09 (Non-Discrimination and Harassment Policy and Grievance Procedure) and amending Chapters 132S-100 (Student Code of Conduct) and 132S-300 (Campus Parking and Traffic Regulations). Additionally, the College is proposing amending various sections of the College's rules to address On May 19, 2020, the Federal Register printed amendments to Title IX regulations [85 FR 30575]. The new regulations address the grievance process for formal complaints of sexual harassment and took effect on August 14, 2020. As an emergency filing of the new WAC Chapter 132S-110 (Title IX Student Conduct Procedures) requires permanent rulemaking within 120 days of the filing, this new WAC is included. Reasons supporting proposal: Proposed rulemaking is needed to provide clarity to the processes for the Student Conduct Code. Other amendments are needed to established rules for parking and traffic regulations, along with minimal amendments to various sections to eliminate gender-specific references with gender-neutral alternatives. The Non-Discrimination and Harassment Policy and Grievance Procedure is proposed for repeal on the basis it is captured in a College Operations Policy and is subject to regular updates based on the Department of Education requirements with the College's Formulation of Policies process more suitable for those changes Additionally, new federal regulations required amendments to the Title IX regulations.
